Another Chance House of Refuge, Inc., a 501(c) (3) non-profit, empowers under-served families and justice-involved individuals in Mecklenburg County. We provide safe housing, case management, education, job training, and self-sufficiency skills. Additionally, we offer essential items, meals, and food for homeless and low-income families. Our transitional homes serve men, women and children involved with the justice system, homelessness or housing insecurity.

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

Our Transitional Housing Program was initiated in response to the growing homelessness crisis and individuals who have experienced incarceration in our community. With a holistic approach, the program aims to provide temporary housing, essential services, and personalized support to individuals and families in transition from homelessness to self-sufficiency.

INTRODUCTION

Our mission is to improve the quality of life of individuals and families by providing a safe environment, safe housing, educational support, employment training, and self-sufficiency skills.

GOALS & OBJECTIVES

- Stability: Provide secure housing for individuals and families in transition.
- Skill Development: Teach life skills like budgeting, cooking, and cleaning for independent living.
- Case Management: Offer personalized plans addressing employment, education, mental health, and more.
- Service Linkages: Connect participants to essential resources like healthcare and employment support.
- Employment & Income: Help secure stable jobs or income sources for long-term self-sufficiency.
- Education & Training: Provide educational and skill-building opportunities for housing stability.
- Legal Assistance: Support resolving legal barriers to stable housing.
- Community Integration: Foster social connections and reduce isolation.
- Housing Placement: Secure affordable, permanent housing for participants.
- Monitoring: Track progress and adjust services to meet evolving needs.
- Empowerment: Involve participants in decision-making to promote autonomy.
- Prevention: Address root causes to prevent recurrence of homelessness.






LESSON LEARNED


Implementing mobile outreach clinics effectively addressed this issue.

Sustainability and Future Plans

- Affordable Housing Initiative: Exploring the acquisition of a housing facility to meet the growing demand for affordable housing.
- Community Exposure Program: Considering the purchase of a van to facilitate field trips, broadening clients' access to new opportunities.
- Family Support Efforts: Providing more rental subsidies to help families achieve self-sufficiency and sustainability.
